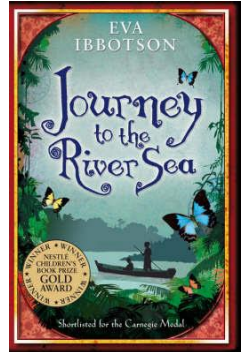


# Sutton Park Primary School

## Curriculum Map - Year 6

### Summer 1 2026



PE will be on a Monday afternoon and Friday afternoon. Please make sure your child has their named PE kit in school.

With SATs on the horizon, Year Six will be busy revising in our Maths and English lessons. We will still be experiencing a broad and balanced curriculum as detailed below. We will also finish reading our set text 'A Journey to the River Sea' and use this to write a Non – Chronological report.

## Is deforestation of the Amazon Rainforest ever justifiable?

### English

In English, children will complete their adventure through the Amazon, where they will experience a variety of writing genres including:

Non – Chronological reports: this will take the form of a cold task on the rainforest, and a hot task on an animal from the rainforest of their choice.

Diary and Letter writing in character.

Argument/debate – Problems of the rainforest. Children will be given roles that they must keep to whilst taking part in the written and oral debate.

### PE

This term, we will focus on playing successfully as a team, playing rounders and also tennis looking at: serving, successful grip and playing both single and double games.

We will also enjoy some 'Health Kick' training from Kidderminster Harriers.

### Music

In Music, we will begin to look at improvisation based in the 'Blues' genre of music focussing on melodic patterns with accurate tone and pitch.

### Science

We will begin the term looking at the Evolution of Man and investigating the work of Charles Darwin which has already evoked lively debate on beliefs in our R.E. sessions.

Following on, we shall then begin to look at fossils, how animals evolve to survive and the timeline of the Earth.

We shall also conduct a scientific enquiry connected to DNA extraction.

### Geography

This term we bring our topic of Rainforests to a close. We will then finish the term with some revision sessions on orienteering.

### PSHE

This term children will investigate the risks associated with using different drugs, including tobacco and nicotine products, alcohol and identifying legal and illegal medicines.

### French

In French, through oracy, vocabulary and phonetic knowledge we will continue to learn about 'Items in daily life', as well as revisiting core basics such as numbers, colours and greetings.

### Art and D&T

Children will continue investigating paint and the effects that can be achieved when painting with watercolour.

In D&T we will finish making our fully working pulley system.

### Maths

After working so hard in the first two terms of the year, we now know we need to work on the following areas in the run up to our SATs:

- Angles.
- Ratio.
- Scaling.
- Money.
- Reflection and Translation.
- Multi step problems.

We will also continue to have arithmetic lessons, working on the four main operations and our times tables.

### Computing

Pupils will continue to build upon their data handling skills including spreadsheets and the importance of formatting data to support calculations.

They will also begin to understand how they can be used to produce calculated data and where this may be used in real life situations.
