



Sutton Park Primary School Year One Curriculum Map Summer Term 2, 2024

How do things grow?

Rationale: This topic will enhance the children's interest in planting and growth. In Year One, we love to work outdoors and the stories we have chosen will give the class opportunities to inspire the children's writing and continue their 'love of reading'.

PE is on Wednesday and Friday. Please make sure all items of clothes are clearly named. A summer hat would also be useful for the sunnier days to come.

Art

As artists, pupils will explore a range of materials and will use recycled materials to create their own sculpture inspired by The Enchanted Owl by Kenojuak Ashevak.

English

We will start our topic with the story of Jim and the Beanstalk. We will be retelling the story orally. This will then help us to rewrite the story in our own words and in the correct order using adjectives to describe nouns. Children will have lots of opportunities to reread their own writing to make sure it makes sense. 'What the Ladybird heard' is set on the farm and we will be using this story, written by Julia Donaldson, to create story maps of how the two thieves stole the fine prize cow! We will continue with daily Read Write Inc sessions to consolidate our knowledge of sounds as well as practising the formation of our letters.

KASE

Our curriculum is designed to ensure the children build their knowledge whilst having opportunities to develop important attributes like teamwork and empathy. We plan for a clear progression of skills and provide a wealth of experiences to further their engagement and understanding. We therefore call this our KASE curriculum.

Science/Geography

To become Scientists and Geographers, we will be looking again at the natural world of plants and trees. We will be growing plants in an allotment to see them develop and grow and mapping the environment.

PE

This half term we will be developing our athletics skills in preparation for our Sports day. This will include jumping over hurdles, relay races and throwing techniques.

RE

During our RE sessions, we will be exploring how we should care for our world and for others and why it matters?

Design and Technology

This half term, we will be learning how to sew pieces of fabric together to make a pouch. This will be the result of answering the question: 'How can two pieces of fabric keep you warm?'

PSHE / Thrive

This term we will be learning about money and where it comes from, and we can save it or make choices on how to spend it. We will also explore the different jobs people can do to earn money.

Music

In music children will be introduced to a range of tuned and untuned instruments, through a simple study of Gamelan.

Maths

Year One will continue developing their place value skills so they can recognise the value of digits up to 100. Children will also explore fractions of an object, shape and quantity. We will also be practising telling the time to the hour and half past the hour. They will draw the hands on a clock face to show these times. Children will continue to develop their multiplication and division skills so they can begin to solve problems.

Computing

This term, in computing the children will be introduced to on screen programming called scratch Jr. Through this, they will be introduced to the early stages of program design with the introduction of algorithms.
